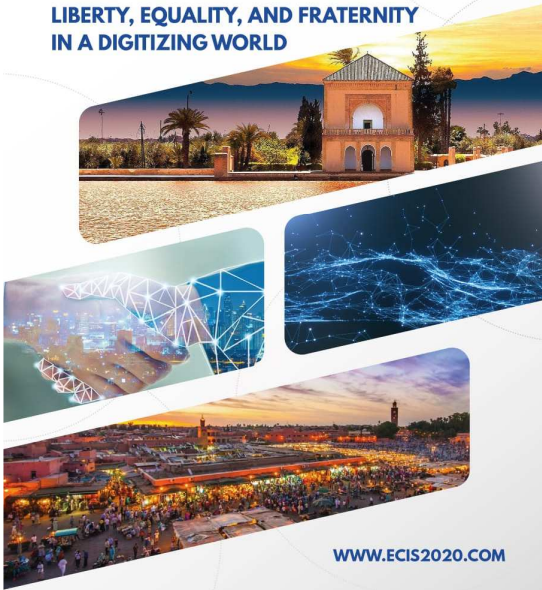

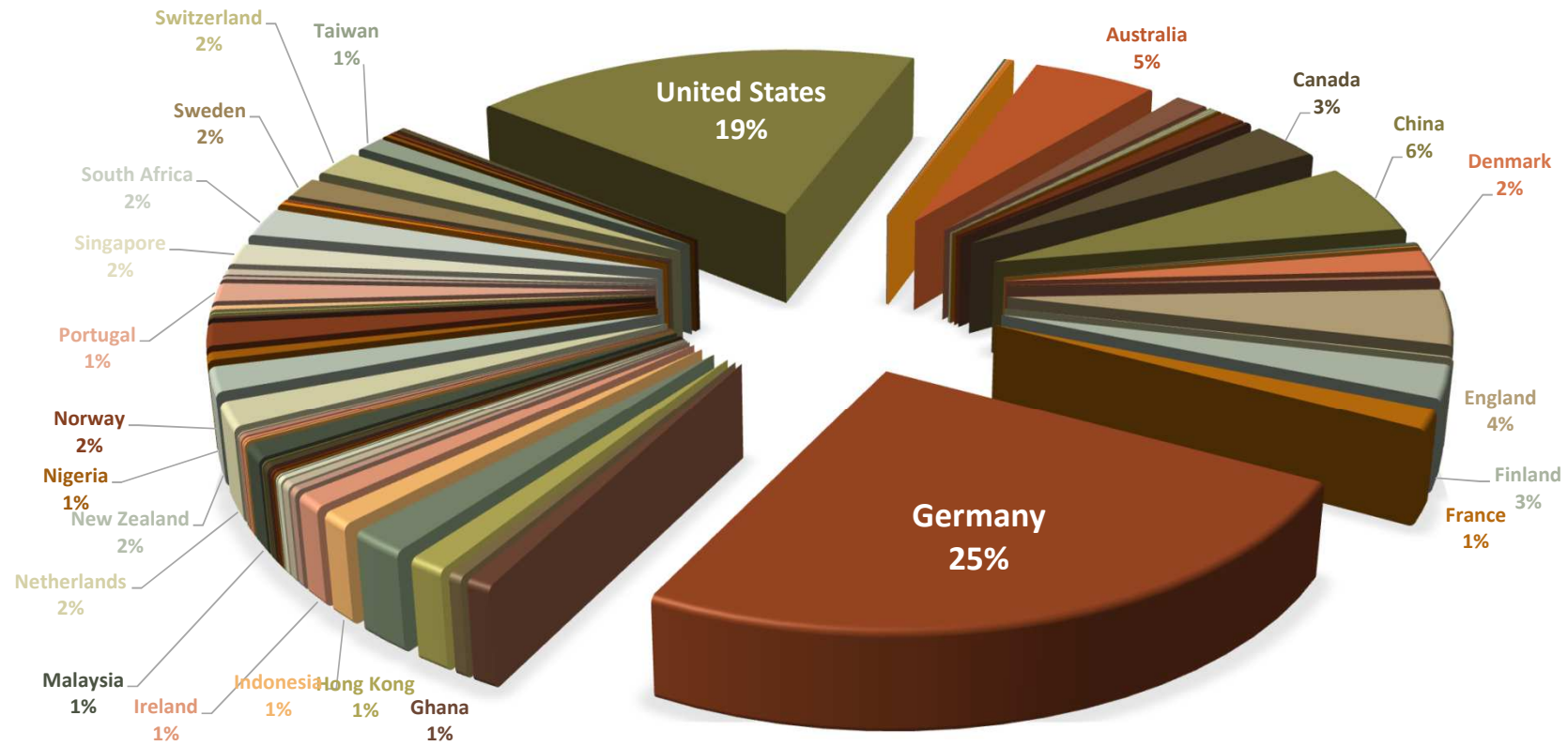

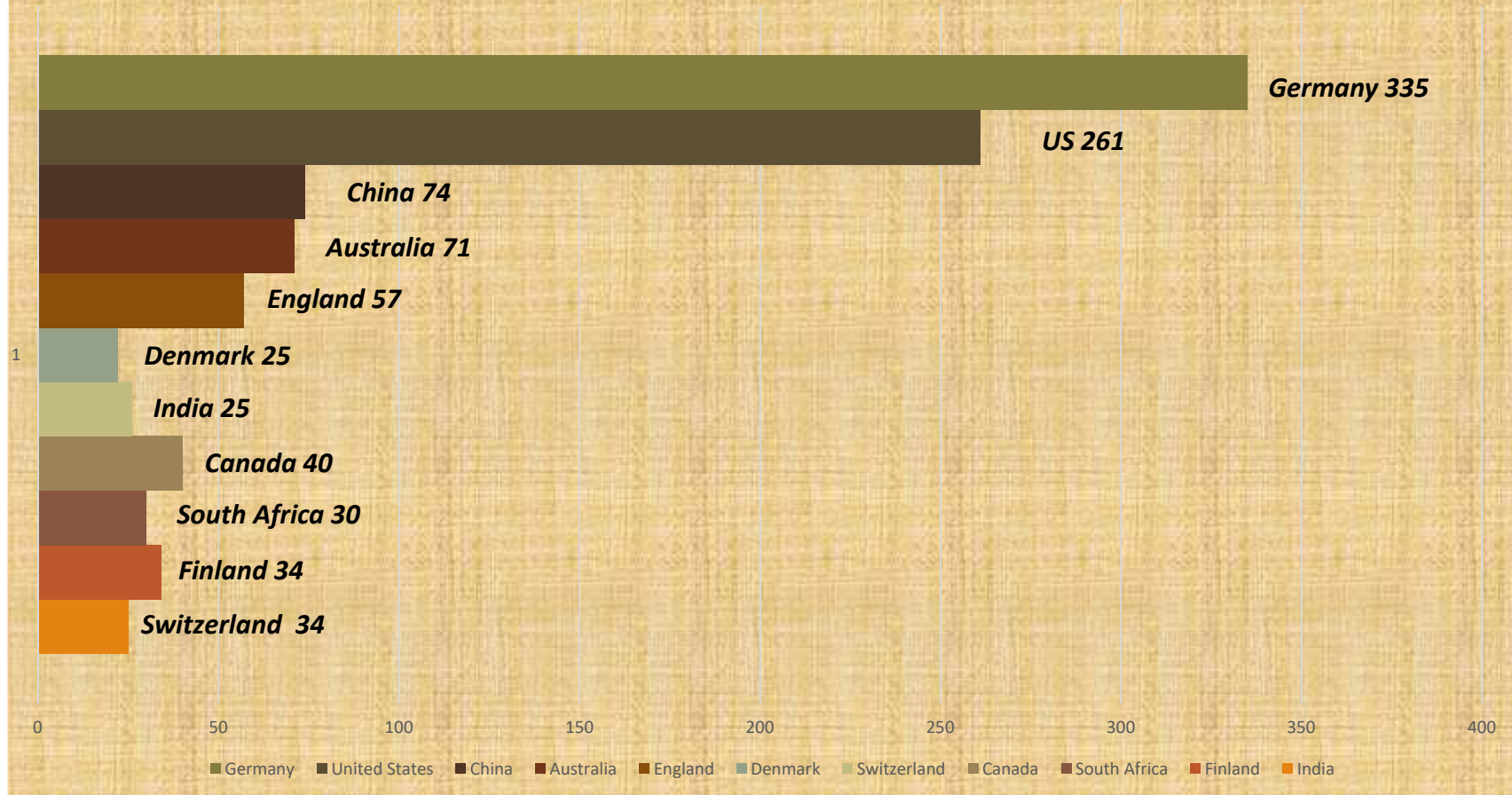

ECIS 2021 Theme: Human Values Crisis in a Digitizing World

- After migrants facing environmental, political and economic disasters, the current pandemic is highlighting that crisis can affect all countries and people of all conditions.
- Digital technologies are often presented as at least part of the solution for helping to drive towards a sustainable and inclusive future. Yet at the same time, digital technologies have also been identified as a threat to our :
 - freedoms (*e.g., in relation to our privacy*),
 - fairness (*e.g., with the digital divide decreasing the economic opportunities for some, and with robotization causing unemployment levels for others*), and
 - to community (*e.g., with social media reducing face-to-face relationships between people even while online connections may be increasing*).
- How can technology help save lives without imprisoning us? How do individuals, organizations, African and European national and local governments among others, respond to such challenges for human values? Can we see solutions emerging independently of the FAANGs ?What role'(s) do IS researchers and community can play?
